Essay Guidelines

- ◆ Essays should address the topic “Walk a Mile in My Shoes”.
- ◆ Girls between the ages of 11-14 years old as of December 1st are eligible to enter.
- ◆ Essays should be no less than 500 words and no more than 1000 words.
- ◆ Essays must be your original work.
- ◆ Essays must not contain any swears or profane language.
- ◆ Essays must be written in English.
- ◆ Essays must be typed in 12 point font and single-spaced. Note: If you do not have access to a computer or typewriter please let us know and we will make arrangements for you.
- ◆ Entry forms must be signed by a parent or guardian and submitted with all essays. Only essays submitted with a signed entry form will be considered for the contest.
- ◆ All essays must be postmarked no later than **Friday, December 1st, 2006.** Essays can also be submitted via fax, or emailed as a Word document by 5:00 p.m. Friday, December 1st. If faxing your essay, please also mail the original for photocopying.
- ◆ Essays will be judged on creativity, originality, and expressiveness.
