“Walk A Mile In My Shoes”
Essay Book Cover Contest

Create a cover for our book of essays! Each year girls throughout Boston share their stories about what it's like to be a girl today in the annual Camille Cosby “Walk a Mile in My Shoes” Essay Contest. You are invited to submit a cover for our book that illustrates what it's like to be a girl today. You do not have to enter the essay contest to design the cover. All artwork will be on display at our annual essay contest awards luncheon and one lucky girl (or groups of girls) will have her art featured as the cover of our essay book.

Artwork Guidelines

- ◆ All submissions should capture the theme of *what it's like to be a girl today in urban America*.
- ◆ Girls between the ages of 11-14 years old as of December 7th 2007 residing in the greater Boston area are eligible to enter.
- ◆ Art must be done on standard 8 1/2 x11 paper and must be photocopy ready– i.e. not folded.
- ◆ Art must be original, illustrating your unique ideas about what it's like to be a girl today in urban America.
- ◆ Art work must bear the exact title of the essay contest along with the date:
Camille Cosby “Walk a Mile in My Shoes” Essay Contest January 2008.
- ◆ Only one submission per person is permitted.
- ◆ Girls are allowed to work in groups of no more than three persons, but an entry form must be submitted for each individual and the \$50 cash prize will be divided evenly between participants.
- ◆ All submissions must include an entry form signed by a parent or guardian. **Only entries submitted with a signed entry form will be considered for the contest.**
- ◆ All entries must be postmarked no later than **Friday, December 7th, 2007. Faxed entries will NOT be accepted.**
- ◆ All entries will be judged on creativity, originality, expressiveness and accurate presentation of the theme.
- ◆ All those who submit artwork are invited to the award luncheon January 21st and the winner will be announced at that time.
