Art Guidelines

- ☞ Create a picture of what it's like to be a girl today in urban America. Use any materials you like! BUT all artwork MUST be **one-dimensional**.
- ☞ 11-14 year-old-girls (as of December 12, 2008) who live in Boston, Cambridge, or Somerville are eligible to enter.
- ☞ Artwork must be done on standard 8 1/2 x 11 paper and must be photocopy ready--i.e. not folded or stapled.
- ☞ Artwork must be original.
- ☞ Artwork must include the exact title of the essay contest along with the date:
Camille Cosby "Walk a Mile in My Shoes" Essay Contest January 2009.
- ☞ Only one submission per person is permitted.
- ☞ Submissions must include an entry form signed by a parent or guardian.
Only entries submitted with a signed entry form will be considered for the contest.
- ☞ Entries will be judged on creativity, originality, expressiveness and accurate presentation of the theme: *what it's like to be a girl today in urban America.*
- ☞ Everyone who submits artwork is invited to the awards luncheon on January 19th where the winner will be announced.
- ☞ Entries must be postmarked by **Friday, December 12, 2008**. **Faxed entries will NOT be accepted.**
